Serve for Kids proceeds benefit the Bill Wright Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) at the Community Healing Centers, supporting programs that treat and prevent child abuse in Southwest Michigan. Not only does Serve for Kids benefit the CAC, but it also supports the STREET After School & Summer Program for boys living in Kalamazoo County.

Roof Sit raises funds to support the Community Healing Centers' Children's Programs, including the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) and our Infant & Early Childhood Mental Health Services.

Coming Together Conference is a collaboration between Community Healing Centers and the Specialty Program in Alcohol and Drug Abuse at Western Michigan University. Professionals from fields including medical law, social work, and education will be joined by national experts and spokespersons in a full day of presentations and workshops. We hope to reduce the stigma associated with treatment and recovery, while facilitating conversation and partnerships with a variety of community organizations.

Carol's Hope is a crisis intervention facility in Berrien County that provides a supervised, supportive setting for individuals with substance use and co-occurring disorders. As an alternative to emergency room care, the center provides clients a welcoming environment where individuals can develop a Recovery Plan and connect to services.
